Physical Development

We will be learning to use scissors and glue sticks.

Expressive Arts and Design

We will be exploring different instruments and their sounds.

Personal, Social, Emotional Development

We will be learning how to take turns and share.

We will be talking about our feelings.

Communication and Language

We will be practising speaking with awareness of the listener in a clear simple sentence.

We will be learning to speak in longer sentences using the words *because, and, then*.

We will be using new vocabulary from our topic.

Understanding of the World

We will be learning about our planet and how to look after it.

We will be learning about the different countries in the world.

We will be learning about recycling.

Mathematics

We will be learning to recognise numerals to 5 or 10.

We will be learning how to write some numbers.

We will be learning to show numbers 0-10 on our fingers.

We will be learning to follow and describe a route.

We will be learning number songs.

We will be learning how to count the correct amount of objects to match a numeral.

We will be making and completing a two function pattern with shapes.

We will be counting orally up to 10 and beyond.

We will be learning to identify some 2d shapes.

Here are some ways you can help your child at home this term.

Literacy

Talk to your child about what they are doing at school and who their friends are. Encourage them to speak in a full sentence.

Practise our Talk Homework, Pussy Cat Pussy Cat.

Read daily to your child and record reading in 'My Reading Record'. Talk about the different parts of the book-front/back cover and spine.

Remember to send your child's book back on their allocated day (details in record book).

Please practise writing some of the letters in their name.

Ask your child to retell a favourite story.

Mathematics

Practise counting from 1-10 or to 20

Practise writing numerals to 5 or 10.

Count up to 3, 5, or 10 objects.

Practise using positional language such as under, in, on, in front, behind, next to.

Describe your walk home or to school for example turn right/left, go straight, across the road, around the corner.

Show numbers/amounts up to 10 on your fingers.

Other learning activities

Practise using scissors to cut out pictures from a magazine.

Go to the Children's Library on Porchester Road.

Practise climbing up and down stairs independently.

Encourage your child to use a fork, knife and spoon independently.

Support your child with pulling up zip on their coat.

Labelling

Remember to label **everything** that is sent to school with your child's first name and surname. This includes hats, gloves, coats, trousers, jumpers, school bags and water bottles. Please send a complete set of spare clothes including socks, underwear, trousers, t-shirt, shoes and jumper in the case of accidents which can be left in a labelled bag on their peg.
