

SATs - Important information for Year 6 parents

Dear Parents and Carers,

The SATs tests will take place during the week commencing 12th May 2025.

There are many different types of ways to help your child:

- One way is to encourage them to do their homework on a weekly basis and for them to read every day for at **least 30 minutes**. Children who read regularly at home are the children who are the most successful in school. Ask them questions about what they have read such as, 'What does the word unique tell you?' or 'Why did the author choose that word?'
- **Another way is to encourage your child to be in bed at a reasonable time so that they are ready to learn in the morning.**
- Children should know **all** of their times tables. If your child does not know them all then they are at a severe disadvantage when it comes to do the end-of-year tests. If they don't know them all, please practise with them. If they practise every day for a couple of weeks, then they'll definitely know them and, with regular practise, they'll remember them. MyMaths website has some great times tables games.
- There are a wide variety of books that you can buy to help your child with their SATs. Here are some books that you might wish to purchase to help your child with their school work and SATS Tests this year.

The following books are from the publisher CGP. You can buy them at WHSmith stores and online at **Amazon**. (They range in price but are usually no more than £6.00 each).

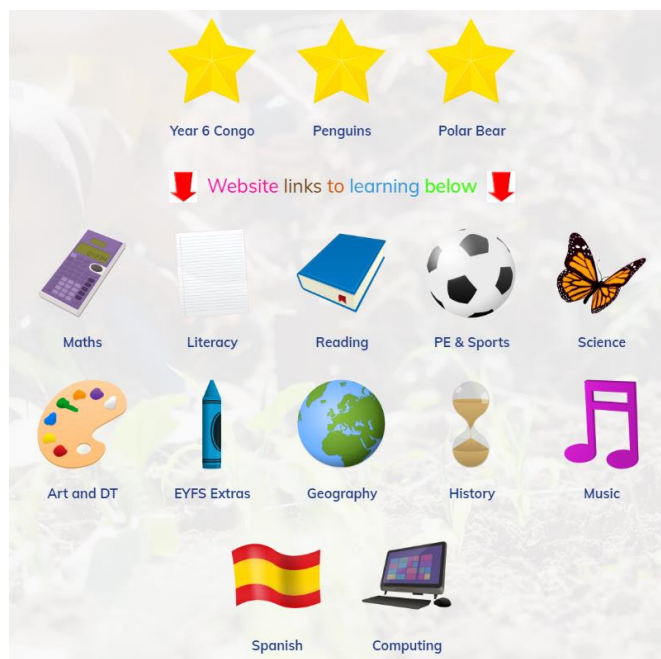
