Curriculum Overview for Parents and Guardians

Literacy

We will be reading:

Dipal's Diwali

All about
Remembrance Day

All about Bonfire Night

Kipper's Birthday

Hetty's Hanukkah

All about Christmas

We will be learning to
sing our morning song,
days of the week and
weather song.

We will be learning
about recognising
sounds of animals and
our environment such
as cars, taps, doors
and babies. We will be
learning about words
that rhyme such as cat
and hat.

We will be practising
how to follow a line
pattern or form the
first letter of our
names.

Physical Development

We will be learning to use
scissors and glue sticks.

We will be learning how to
hold and use a pencil.

We will be learning how to put
on our coats, gloves, hats, and
scarves.

We will be practising using a
knife, spoon and fork
independently.

Our topic this term is Celebrations



Expressive Arts and Design

We will pretend to plan and
organise parties.

We will sing familiar songs.

We will draw or paint a picture
and talk about it.

Personal, Social, Emotional Development

We will be learning how to take
turns and share.

We will be learning about daily
routines.

We will be learning how to help
at tidy up time.

We will learning how to say how
we feel and why.

Communication and Language

We will be learning to say a simple sentence in a
clear and loud voice.

We will be talking about the books we read.

We will be learning how to follow a simple
instruction like get your coat or open your bag.

Understanding of the World

We will be learning about different celebrations
such as Diwali, Christmas and birthdays.

We will be learning about the different countries
in the world.

We will be learning about seasonal changes and
the weather.

We will be learning

to 5 or 10.

to count up to 5 or
10.

to count objects to 3
or 6 and find the
numeral to match.

We will be learning
to show numbers 0-
10 on our fingers.

We will be learning
about simple 2D
shapes.

We will be learning
about days of the
week.

We will be learning
number songs.

We will be learning
to make marks to
represent numbers.

We will be learning
to compare two
groups of objects
saying which one has
more or fewer.

Autumn One- Nursery 'Home Learning'

Here are some ways you can help your child at home this term.

Literacy

Talk to your child about what they are doing at school and who their friends are.

Practise the rhymes 5 little monkeys, 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 once I caught a fish alive and 5 little ducks.

Read daily to your child and record reading in 'My Reading Record'. Talk about their favourite part of the story and the characters.

Remember to send your child's book back on their allocated day (details in record book).

Please practise writing the first letter of their name with your child.

Labelling

Remember to label **everything** that is sent to school with your child's first name and surname. This includes hats, gloves, coats, trousers, jumpers, school bags and water bottles. Please send a complete set of spare clothes including socks, underwear, trousers, t-shirt, shoes and jumper in the case of accidents which can be left in a labelled bag on their peg.

Mathematics

Practise counting from 1-5, 10 or even to 20!

Practise counting objects to 5 like pencils, cars, or cups.

Find shapes on your walk home like a rectangular shaped door.

Look for things that are bigger than your child and things that are smaller than your child.

Find numbers in your house and on your walk home.

Count your steps as you walk up to 5 or 10 then start again!

Other learning activities

Practise using scissors to cut out pictures from a magazine.

Go to the Children's Library on Porchester Road.

Practise climbing up and down stairs independently.

Encourage your child to use a fork, knife and spoon independently.

Encourage your child to put on and take off their coat independently.
