Curriculum Overview for Parents and Guardians

Physical Development

We will be learning to use scissors and glue sticks.

We will be learning how to put on our coats, gloves, hats, and scarves.

We will be practising using a knife, spoon and fork independently.

We will be learning how to move about the Nursery safely.

We will be learning how to keep healthy.

Our topic this term is Fairy Tales and Nursery Rhymes



Expressive Arts and Design

We will be acting out fairy tales and nursery rhymes.

We will explore and describe different materials.

We will be singing rhymes and doing the actions.

Personal, Social, Emotional Development

We will be learning how to take turns and share.

We will be learning about our school values.

We will be learning how to help at tidy up time.

We will learning how to solve a problem with a friend by talking about it.

Communication and Language

We will be practising talking in a loud clear voice and in a simple sentence.

We will be learning how to listen, follow and respond to a simple instruction like get your coat or open your bag.

Understanding of the World

We will be learning about forces and make predictions in an experiment.

We will be learning about the different countries in the world.

We will be exploring and describing different materials.

Mathematics

We will be learning to recognise numerals to 5 or 10.

We will be learning to subitise amounts to 3. Subitise means saying how many objects there are without counting.

We will be learning to show numbers 0-10 on our fingers.

We will be learning to follow and describe a route.

We will be learning number songs.

We will be learning to make marks to represent numbers.

We will be making and completing a two function pattern with shapes.

We will be sorting items by size.

We will be counting orally up to 10 and beyond.

Spring One- Nursery 'Home Learning'

Here are some ways you can help your child at home this term.

Literacy

Talk to your child about what they are doing at school and who their friends are.

Practise nursery rhymes such as Hickory Dickory Dock, Humpty Dumpty or the Grand Old Duke of York.

Read daily to your child and record reading in 'My Reading Record'. Talk about the different parts of the book-front/back cover and spine.

Remember to send your child's book back on their allocated day (details in record book).

Please practise writing some of the letters in their name.

Ask your child to retell a Fairy Tale we have been learning at school.

Mathematics

Practise counting from 1-5 or 10 objects.

Practise writing numerals to 5.

Order 3 objects by size.

Clap a pattern then ask your child to repeat it.

Describe your walk home or to school for example turn right/left, go straight, across the road, around the corner.

Count your steps as you walk up to 5 or 10 then start again!

Other learning activities

Practise using scissors to cut out pictures from a magazine.

Go to the Children's Library on Porchester Road.

Practise climbing up and down stairs independently.

Encourage your child to use a fork, knife and spoon independently.

Support your child with pulling up zip on their coat.

Labelling

Remember to label **everything** that is sent to school with your child's first name and surname. This includes hats, gloves, coats, trousers, jumpers, school bags and water bottles. Please send a complete set of spare clothes including socks, underwear, trousers, t-shirt, shoes and jumper in the case of accidents which can be left in a labelled bag on their peg.
